
The first thing you should have is a VALUABLE SKILL. Yes, you write, but is your writing valuable? You do not have to be a pro-writer; you just have to be good at what you do. You could be a programmer, video-editor, proofreader,...

UI/UX designer, language translator, virtual assistant, tech bro. Whatever it is, someone somewhere is willing to pay for that skill. Always have that in mind.

So, what happens if you do not have a skill? Learn. There are hundreds of valuable skills you can learn.

Earlier in the month, one of my followers started a course to become a product designer. She was a food vendor but seeing as she was interested in earning with a digital skill, she started the course.

The second thing is to HAVE A PORTFOLIO and/or a RESUME ready. A portfolio is a repository of your works. You do not have to be an expert to have a portfolio, start now. I do not think anyone would want to hire someone without a proven track record of excellence.

Resumes are not only meant for people who work in offices. As a freelancer/remote worker, get yourself a resume, a good one too. And if you have to get a portfolio deck, do so to. How? Important: Know what you field requires. A professional grant writer must be familiar with NGOs, and all. Some things are not escapable. You have to know them.



work, and prayers, you will reach out to them. Someone got a job that pays \$1200 monthly after over 37 rejections. You have the skill; you have the platform. You only need positivity. Work on your mindset.
