Brutal truth about Aurangzeb!

1. He was a religious bigot, cunning and cruel to Hindus.

He was keen that the sharia or Islamic law be followed everywhere.

Hindu religious fairs were outlawed in 1668, and an edict of the following year prohibited construction of Hindu temples as well as the repair of old ones.

The duty (internal customs fees) paid on goods was 2.5%, double the amount was levied on Hindu merchants from 1665 onwards

2. According to one historical source, elephants were deployed to crush the resistance in the area surrounding the Red Fort of Hindus who refused to submit to jiziya collectors.

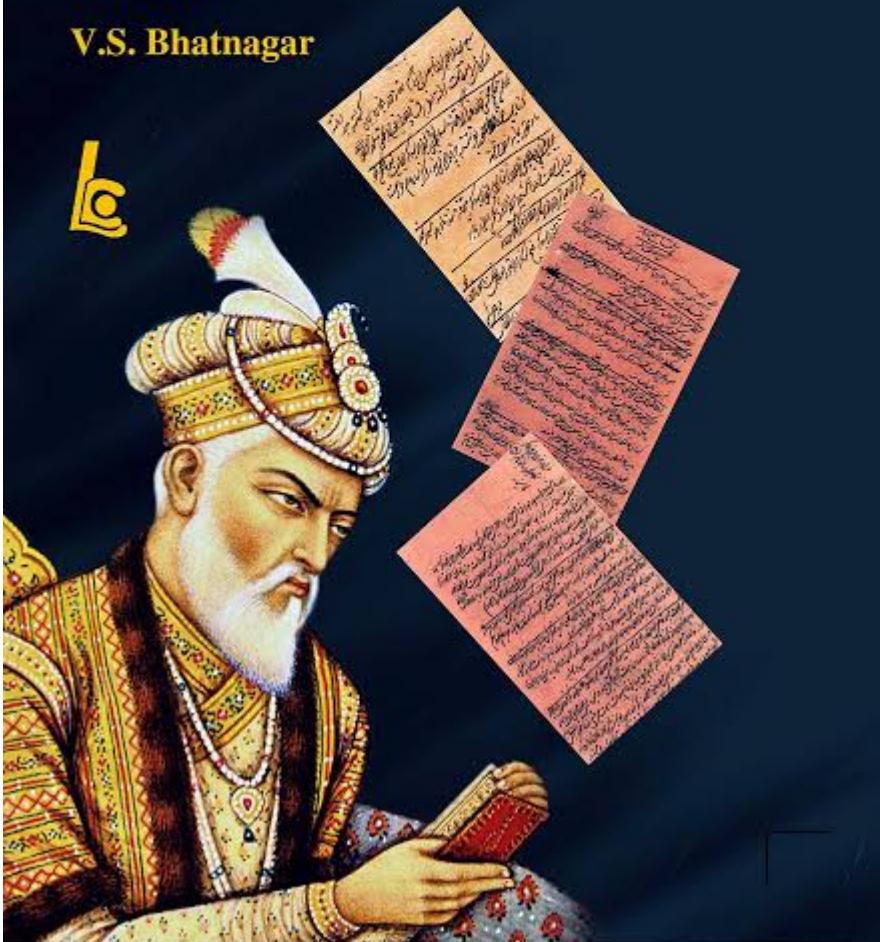

4. Aurangzeb as a ferocious destroyer of Hindu temples and idols.

He did not just build an isolated mosque on a destroyed temple, he ordered all temples to be destroyed, among them the Kashi Vishwanath temple, one of the most sacred places of Hinduism.

He then built mosques on the cleared sites.

Other Hindu sacred temples suffered equal destruction. A few examples: Krishna's birth temple in Mathura; the rebuilt Somnath temple on the coast of Gujarat,



the Vishnu temple replaced with the Alamgir mosque now overlooking Benares; and the Treta-ka-Thakur temple in Ayodhya.

The number of temples destroyed by Aurangzeb is counted in a few tens of thousands.



5. Dara Sikoh (Aurangzeb's brother) was executed for taking an interest in Hindu religion; Sikh Guru Tegh Bahadur was beheaded because he objected to Aurangzeb's forced conversions.

And not to forget the brutal and cruel killing of Sambhaji Maharaj and Bhai Dyal Das.

Population Control, Marauder Style

Last week, the United Nations announced that the world's population had reached seven billion, but there have been times when it headed in the opposite direction, and not in pleasant ways. The savagery of the Mongol conqueror Genghis Khan may have culled the global population by about 11 percent; two bloody upheavals in China — the An Lushan Rebellion and the collapse of the Xin Dynasty — each may have felled about 6 percent of humanity. Those are but 3 of the 100 worst atrocities in history, as cataloged by Matthew White in "The Great Big Book

of Horrible Things," an amusing (really) account of the murderous ways of despots, slave traders, blundering royals, gladiators and assorted hordes. Estimating the tolls from such horrors is an inexact science, given war's nature and the mysteries of antiquity. The deadliest "multicides" are more plentiful in recent centuries, given that there were more people to kill and better ways to kill them on a grand scale. Even so, killings as a percentage of all humanity are probably declining. Below, the sweep of human brutality in a timeline.
