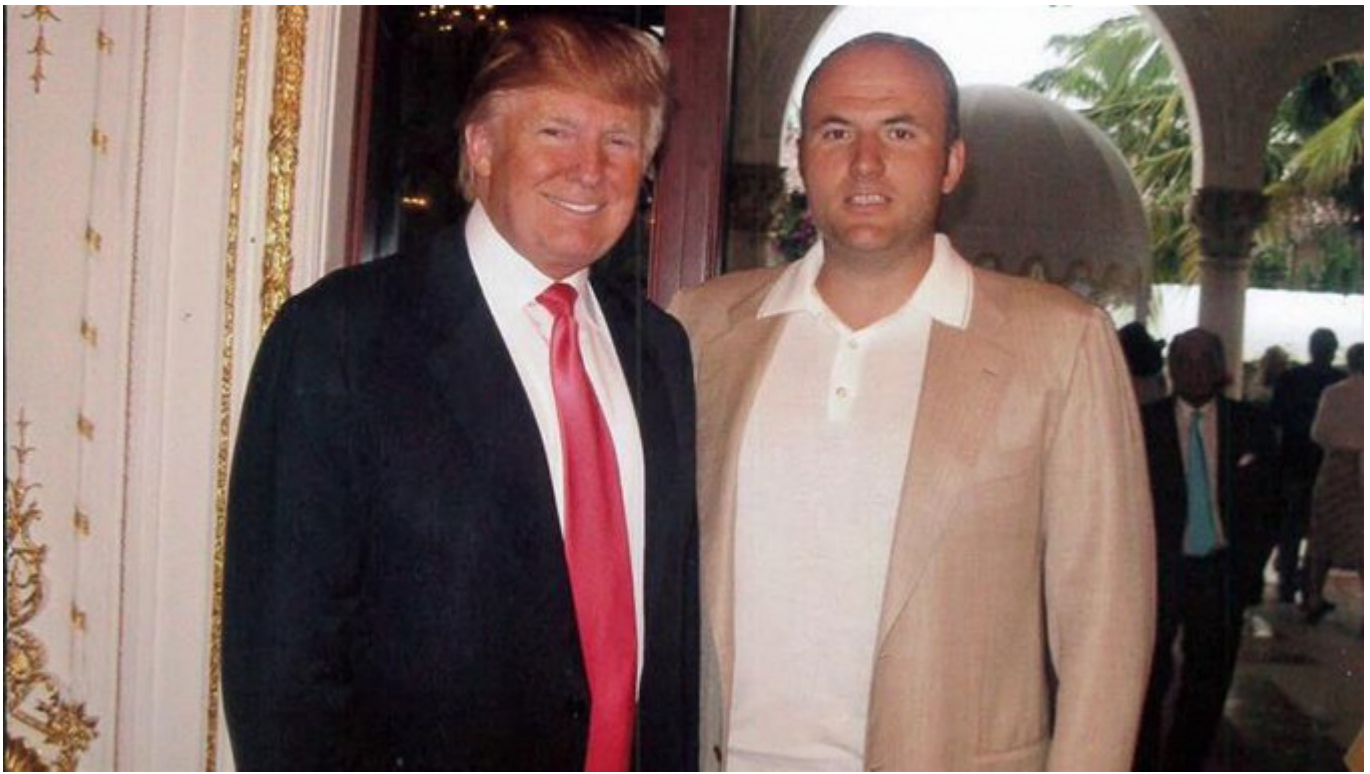


Helsinki Speculation 6/

Love Letter Diplomacy

Love Letter Diplomacy is a foreign policy strategy used to trick [gullible](#) children in charge of countries. *Love Letter* Diplomacy involves sending surreal declarations of affection, in a letter, to a [child-like leader](#). The purpose is to get that leader to make idiotic decisions, if the leader was dumb enough. North Korea is the last nation to use the gambit of the *Love Letter* Diplomacy against the USA under the short Presidency of the feeble-minded [Donald Trump](#).

North Korea's Dictator [Kim Jong Un](#) sent a *Love Letter*. Instead of letting the pressure work, Donald Trump went against his allies and stopped the military drills [unilaterally](#). This is what is called 'winning'.

As Kim Jong Un craved for his [tinpot nation](#) to be seen as a 'superpower' like [China](#), [Russia](#) and the United States, the dictator desperately wanted to have a public meeting without Japan or South Korea, only with the US President. But North Korea sent another *Love Letter* and again, Trump came to a second meeting in [Vietnam](#) instead. This is what [Lucy in Charlie Brown](#) calls 'winning'.

North Korea, the most cruel and [sadistic](#) dictatorship on the planet, worse than [Saudi Arabia](#), had taken Americans [hostage](#). USA had a long-standing [policy of not paying ransom](#) to terrorists who take hostages. Kim Jong Un wrote a *Love Letter* to Trump who had America pay 2 million dollars ransom for [Otto Warmbier](#). Meanwhile Mr Warmbier had been [tortured](#), arrived brain-dead and died shortly after being returned. This is what [Vladimir Putin](#) calls 'winning'.
