Council works to ensure every citizen has access to all city services and represents the interest of the public to other governmental organizations and community stakeholders.

Cleveland City Council is comprised of 17 members, elected every four years, who represent a ward of the city. Each ward consists of approximately 25,000 residents.

Council members serve two roles in their duties: to draft and enact legislation for the city of Cleveland and act as ombudsmen for their constituents.

Council meets as a whole at 7 p.m. on Mondays except during the summer recess and end of session break in December. Council committees typically meet on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays. All meetings are open to the public.

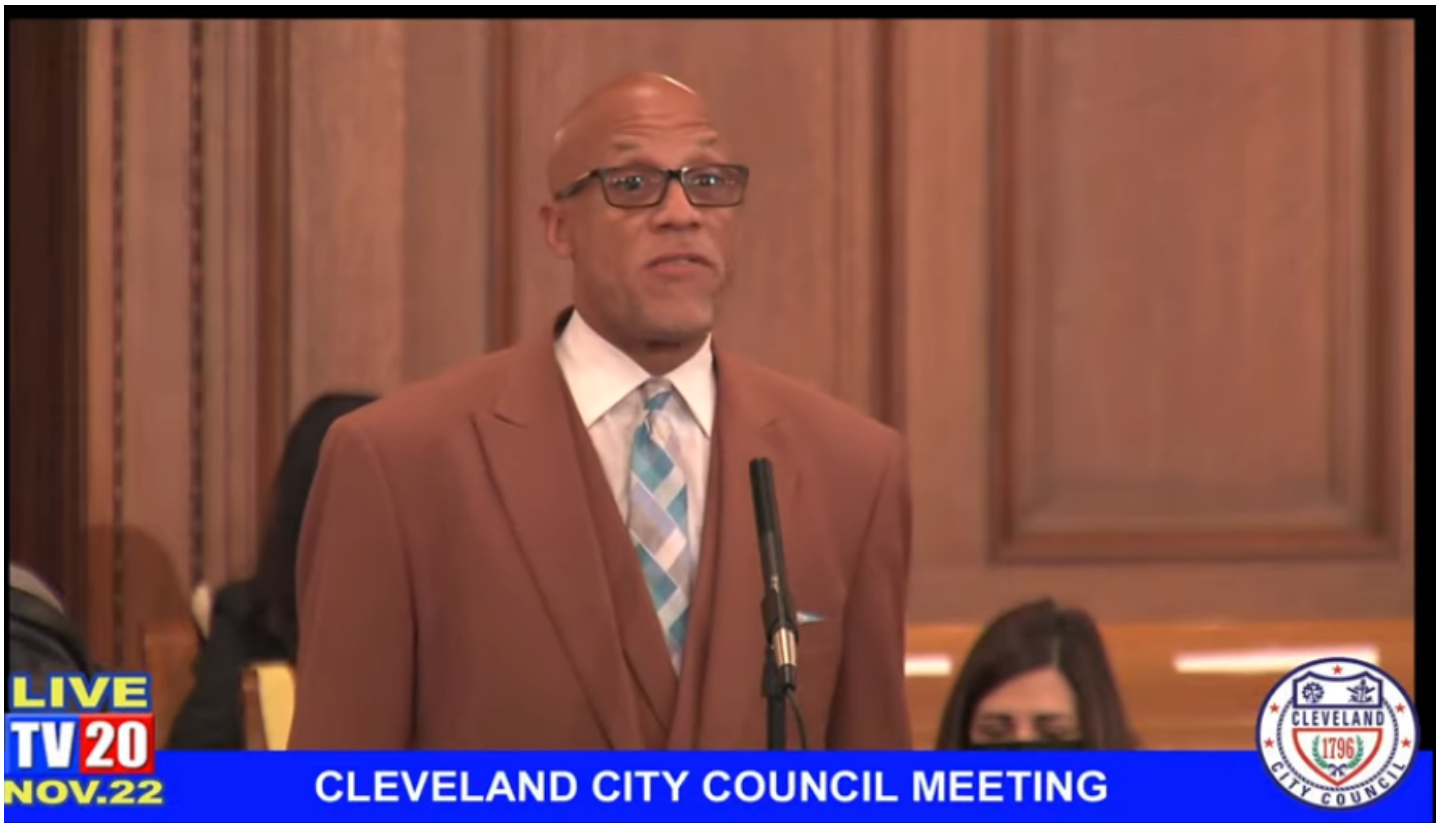
Shakira Johnson is called upon for Public Comment,
