Pancha Varneswarar is the name of the presiding deity, who faces east. The square avudayars are thought to be the lingams installed by rishis and sages, making them extremely ancient and sacred.

The lingam changes color from time to time; no one knows when they will change color or how long they will last. It can last for several days or even months in some cases. Tripurasundari is the name of the mother, and she faces south.

In the Temple grounds, there are shrines to Ganesha, Nardana Ganapati, Dakshinamurthy, Lingothbavar, Brahma, Chandikeswarar, Ayyapan, Navagrahas, and Bhairava.

The lingam's colors are bright yellow, white, red, smoke ash, and an unknown color.
