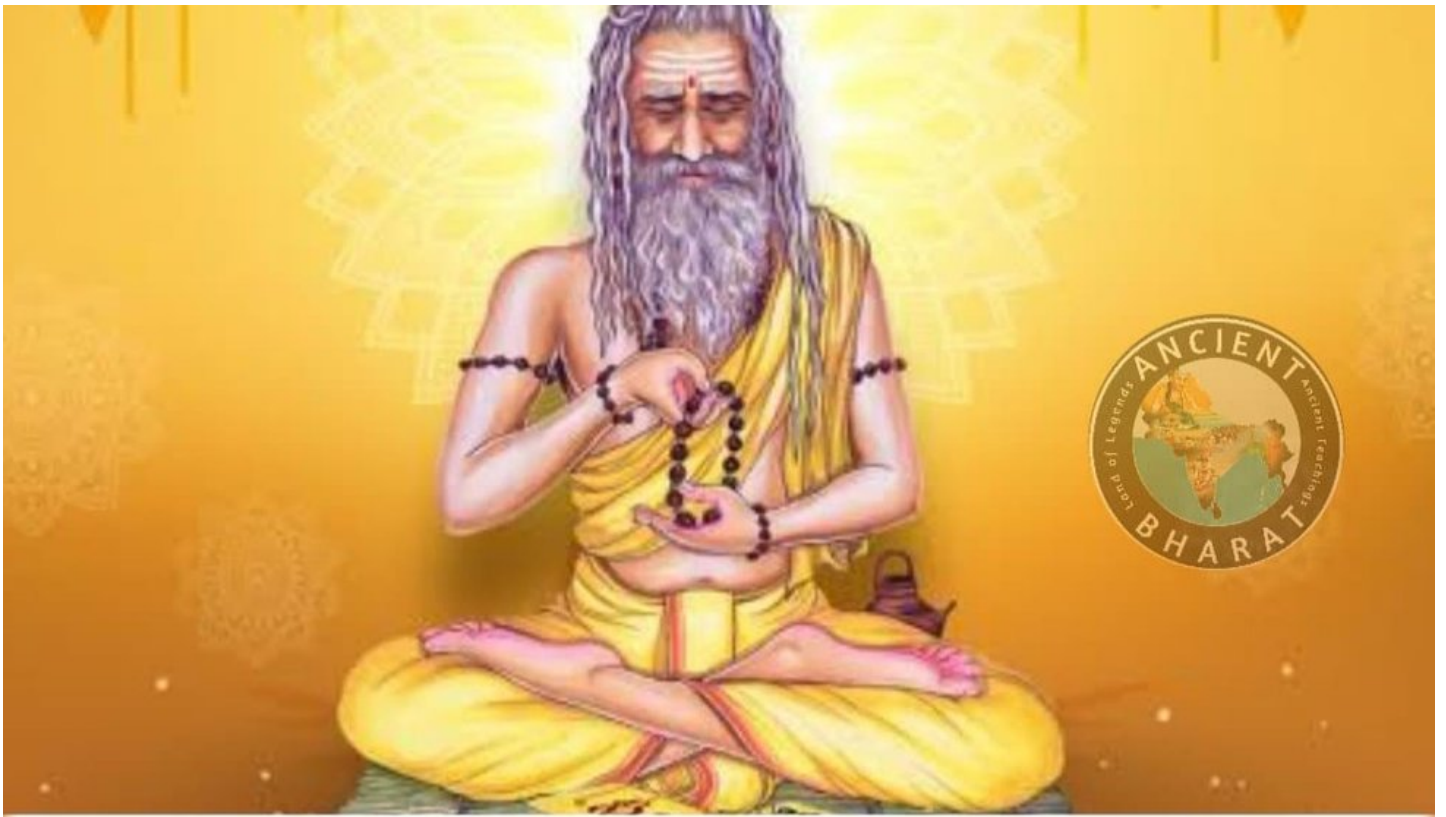

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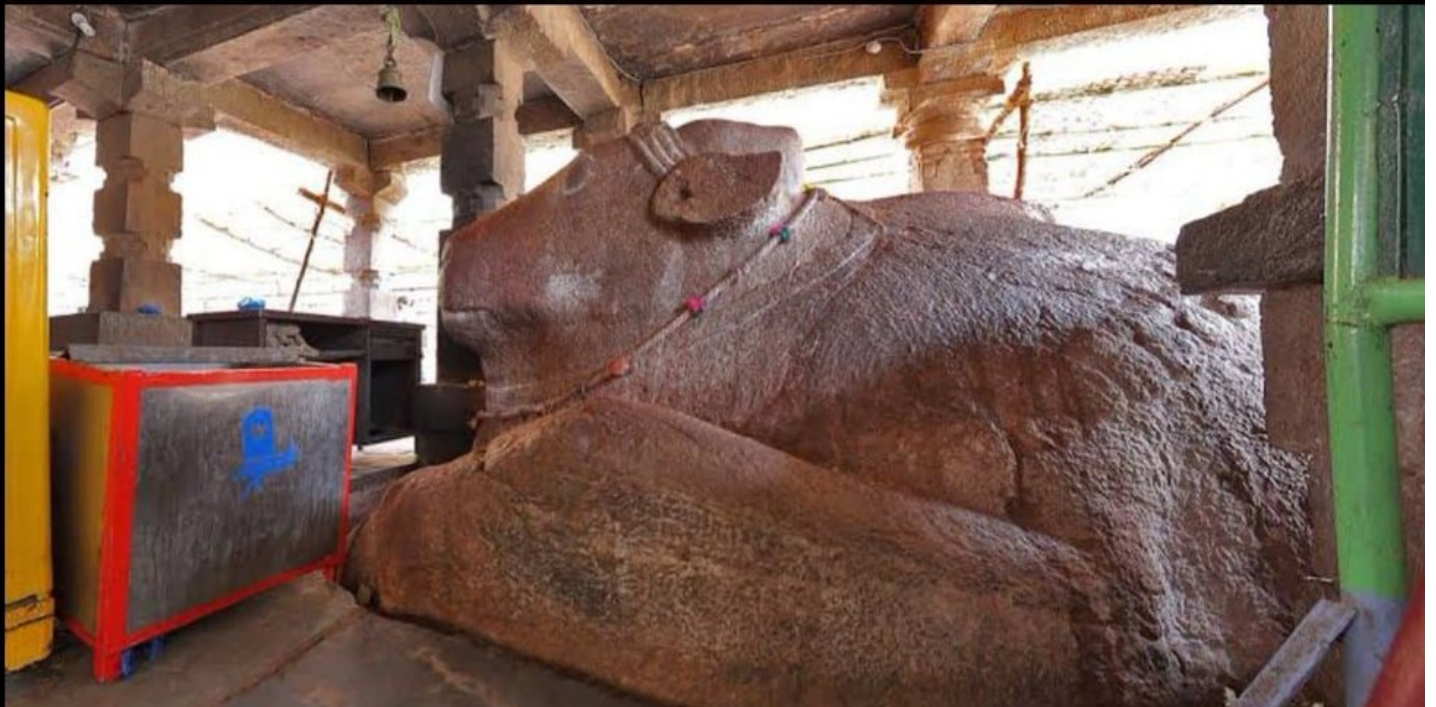

# The Mysterious Growing Nandi OF YAGANTI TEMPLE



Yaganti is one of Andhra Pradesh's most well-known Shiva temples. Pallavas, Cholas, Chalukyas, and Vijayanagara emperors all contributed to the construction of the temple in the 5th and 6th centuries.

When the Kali Yuga ends, the Basavanna (stone nandi) of Yaganti will come alive and shout, according to Potuluri Veera Brahmendra Swamy.

People used to do Pradakshinas (rounds) around it in the past, according to legend. As the size of the Nandi has grown, the temple personnel has already removed one pillar.

The Nandi (Bullock, Lord Shiva's) idol in front of the temple, according to believers, is constantly growing in size.

According to the villagers, the idol was formerly considerably smaller than it is now. They claim that experiments were conducted on this idol and that the sort of rock from which the idol was carved has a growing or increasing characteristic associated with it.

According to the Archaeological Survey of India, rock grows at a rate of one inch every twenty years (10 mm per 8 years).
