





I don't remember what she said. I was frozen to my chair, Papa's green armchair. It must be the arm, I kept telling myself.."


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"...Why would Zardari tell me, a fourteen-year-old girl, that my father had been shot if it had been serious?

Mummy must have called for the car. The next thing I knew she was running towards the door .. "

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

"..They weren't his last words, not for me at least, they meant something larger. That he was speaking at all meant, up until that point, that Papa was OK. He was alive.


Ashiq got out of the driver's seat & holding his arm.. tried again, in vain, to call for help.."

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
"..He got into the open back section, where the policemen sit & the APC drove off. As it neared Do Talwar, it stopped. We heard a single shot.Then it drove off again.'

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"She was accompanied by Wajid Durrani, one of the shooters that night who's seen saluting her in many of photos taken of her arrival..


Abdullah Shah the CM of Sindh (father of current CM Sindh Murad Ali Shah) another accused in the murder, would also be by Benazir's side.."
