Ethnic Crime Families Provoke German Crackdown: Criminal clans of Arab and Kurdish origin clash violently in Berlin and broaden their sway in #Germany. My report via @WSJ

On a rainy morning in a cemetery last month, Berlin's hidden underworld briefly emerged from the shadows. It was the funeral of a gang enforcer who got shot eight times as he took his wife and children for a stroll in a popular park. <u>@WSJ https://t.co/3IMptFwdcZ</u>

Officially, most prominent clan members live off welfare, authorities say, but their empires span illegal activities from prostitution to fueling the city's booming party industry with drugs. More recently, the families have branched into legal ventures <u>https://t.co/3IMptFwdcZ</u>

Sami, who said he had shared a prison cell with Mr. Rabih, said new gangs were disturbing Berlin's criminal equilibrium. "Now it's like New York here: Chechens, Kurds, Albanians, Russians, Moroccans, Turks, Gypsies," he said. "Everyone wants their share." <u>https://t.co/3IMptFwdcZ</u>
