A footnote to yesterday's Drakefordgate that's being overlooked....

Wales has consciously moved away from the recommendations of the Joint Committee for Vaccinations and Immunisation (JCVI) instead it prioritised care home workers, and (largely) healthcare workersworkers

- residents in a care home for older adults and their carers
- all those 80 years of age and over and frontline health and social care workers
- 3. all those 75 years of age and over
- 4. all those 70 years of age and over and clinically extremely vulnerable individuals [footnote 1]
- 5. all those 65 years of age and over
- 6. all individuals aged 16 years [footnote 2] to 64 years with underlying health conditions which put them at higher risk of serious disease and mortality [footnote 3]
- 7. all those 60 years of age and over
- 8. all those 55 years of age and over
- 9. all those 50 years of age and over

2/ We know this because a memo from Len Richards, CEO of Cardiff & Vale Health Board, that states this:-

On that basis the delivery of vaccines has been limited throughout December to the Mass Vaccination Centre in Splott, and has been focused on the delivery of the vaccination of staff from both Health and Social Care services. This will continue over the rest of December, with a short break on the 25th, 26th & 27th. There has been a pilot study carried out in Betsi and Hywel Dda which involved delivering the Pfizer Vaccine within Care Home facilities and in doing so vaccinating Care Home residents. This has proved very staff intensive (given the logistical challenge) and at a time when the service is stretched for staff we are taking the next few weeks to consider what learning there is from that pilot. We are also mindful that the Oxford vaccine is imminent and the logistics for that vaccine are less restrictive and so offer us a more effective approach to the vaccination of care home residents and citizens in general.

Since then, the situation has improved. Although the Health Board had managed to vaccinate a further 1,682 healthcare and 445 social care workers 2 days later, only a further 364 vulnerable persons had been vaccinated leaving them at extended risk of contracting Covid 19





A look at mortality data for Wales paints a dismal picture.


