


City Solutions Platform Outcomes

People sleeping rough in Sydney will soon be taken off the streets and given a key to an apartment with a tenancy agreement, under a radical new plan to tackle homelessness.

The Common Ground initiative brings together the public and private sectors to make available either purchased or newly-built apartments to homeless people for 30 per cent of their earnings.

Residents will be able to stay as long as they need and during their tenancy will have access to outreach programs such as drug and alcohol counselling, education and employment training.

The concept is based on a model established in 1990 by Rosanne Haggerty, a leading
