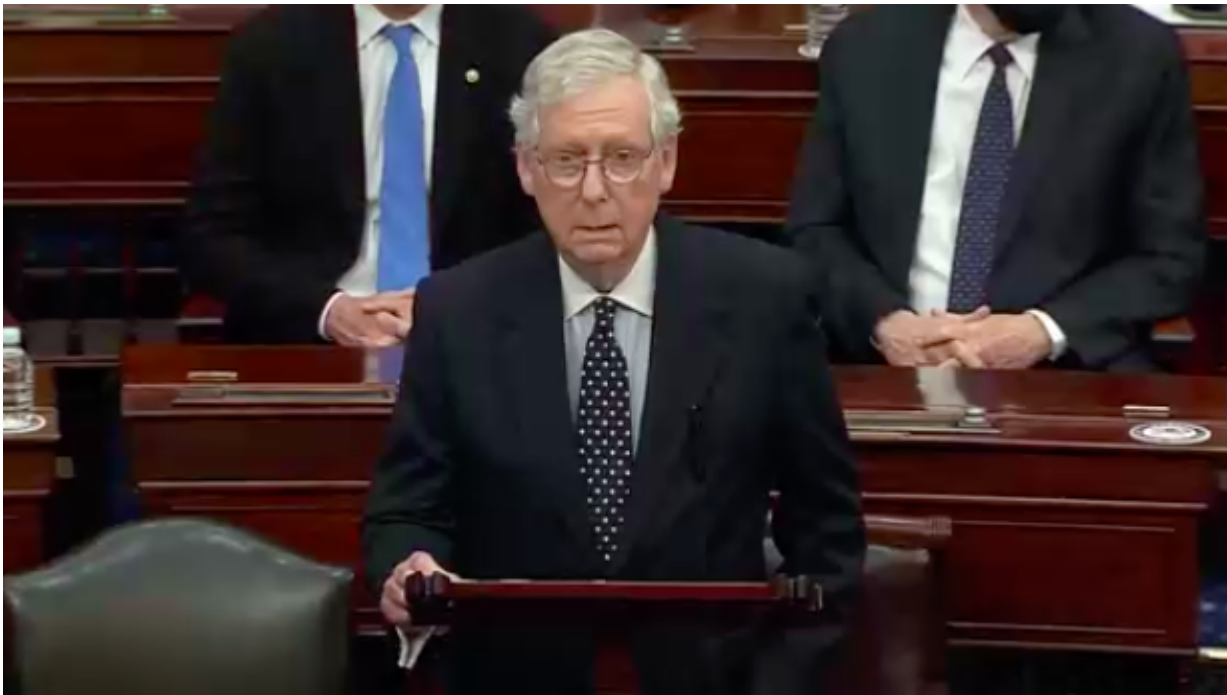

"We're debating a step that has never been taken in American history" to overrule the voters, says @senatemajldr. "This will be the most important vote I've ever cast."



"Nothing before us proves illegality anywhere near the massive scale...that would have tipped the entire election," says @senatemajldr.
