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8. <u>@ATT</u> told Popular Information that it is a member of the Business Roundtable, which issued a statement on 1/4 stating there "is no authority for Congress to reject or overturn electoral votes lawfully certified by the states."

9. <u>@ATT</u> would not say whether it would continue to support members of Congress who vote to subvert the vote anyway.

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10. <u>@Microsoft</u> told Popular Information the following: "We weigh a number of factors in making political contribution decisions, and will consider this and other issues in making future contribution decisions"

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11. <u>@Pfizer</u> told Popular Information that the company's CEO, Albert Bourla, signed a letter saying there should be no further delay in the transfer of power. The company would not address its plans for future donations.

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@pfizer 12. @bostonsci sent Popular Information this statement.

@WellsFargo declined to comment.

The rest of the companies we identified did not respond to comment.

Along with the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, the National Association of Manufacturers and others, we call for elected officials to respect the democratic process and the election outcome.
