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The availability of this defense makes it more likely that the instigators—including Trump—face prosecution.

How would it look to a jury if the people who incited the failed insurrection go free, while the foot soldiers doing their bidding pay the price?

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Such an outcome is offensive to the idea of fairness and equal justice for all.

What it may take to stop these liars— and deter others from spreading lies — will be seeing their names dragged into a criminal trial as part of a defense, which shines the spotlight on them.

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The Trumps, <u>@tedcruz</u>, <u>@HawleyMO</u>, and <u>@KellyannePolls</u> of the world who have made their careers stirring the mob to a frenzy with lies never cared that their lies have deadly consequences.
