Alberta's health minister says suggestions that a new health bill will allow him to snoop on citizens' medical records are "ridiculous."

Bill 46, an omnibus piece of legislation introduced last week, proposes putting the minister and Alberta Health in charge of who can access Netcare, which holds Albertans' electronic health records. The bill seeks to amend the Health Information Act, among other legislation.

"This is about the ministry and AHS [Alberta Health Services] being able to work together and sharing their information so they can come to government with policy recommendations," Health Minister Tyler Shandro said at a news conference on Monday.

Personal health data of Albertans can now legally be shared outside of Alberta. Little can be done to address breaches of privacy. By allowing entities that reside outside of Alberta to access Netcare information, the security of personal health data is compromised.

McMillan said there is no plan to give people outside Canada access to Netcare. Workers in other parts of Canada would be subject to privacy law in their jurisdictions and any professional standards.

"The plan is to enable access to health care providers in provinces and territories, for the purpose of providing health services to Albertans," McMillan said. "Immediate plans will be to focus on Lloydminster."

Hardcastle said some of the proposed changes in Bill 46 don't give the minister any new powers, but have drawn attention to extraordinary powers the public may not have known health ministers have, she said.

"This government has maybe shown itself as one that's willing, in order to aggressively implement their agenda, to do things that they're legislatively authorized to, but that other governments might have achieved through more conciliatory means," she said.

Sharon Polsky, president of the Privacy and Access Council of Canada, has several concerns with the bill as proposed.

She said it seeks to change the definition of how video and audio of patients are recorded without their knowledge, which opens the door to more telehealth recordings.

It's no secret that UCP is moving towards virtual healthcare to augment and possibly replace the current primary care model in Alberta.

That includes providing access to Netcare to digitally based physician services.

Telus Health Babylon now has access to Netcare data.

approved hospitals or to any type, grade or size-group of approved hospitals the Minister may specify.

(3) If model bylaws are prescribed pursuant to this section, the Minister may, by order, direct

- (a) that bylaws of the same or like effect must be enacted by the board or must be prepared and adopted by the medical staff and approved by the board, as the case may be, in respect of all approved hospitals or in respect of the type, grade or size group of approved hospitals to which the model bylaws have been designated as applicable, and
- (b) that true copies of the bylaws and amendments shall be sent to the Minister within 6 months of the date of publication of the Minister's order.

(4) The approval of a bylaw by the Minister may be withdrawn at any time by notice in writing to the board of the hospital and, on that withdrawal, the bylaw for which approval has been withdrawn ceases to have effect.

Administrator

20.31 The board of each approved hospital shall appoint an administrator and shall appoint or shall cause to be appointed, as the bylaws or regulations may require, any other officers and employees required for the efficient operation of the hospital and shall prescribe their duties, remuneration and other terms of employment.

Records of treatment

20.32(1) The board of each approved hospital shall cause to be kept by the attending physician or any other person providing diagnostic or treatment services to a patient a record of the diagnostic and treatment services provided in respect of each patient in order to assist in providing a high standard of medical care.

(2) **Except as permitted or required** under this Part, a board or employee of a board, the Minister or a person authorized by the Minister or a physician may disclose health information obtained from hospital records or from persons having access to them only in accordance with the *Health Information Act*.

So there is no need to replace physicians who are moving out of Alberta. Telus Health Babylon now has access to patients' personal health information.

A primary care physician is not required to be a resident of Alberta to practice in Alberta. They can live anywhere in Canada.

Of course they would be subject to their own jurisdiction's health data privacy legislation. Breaches are impossible to regulate with this legislation.

What stops physicians outside AB from breaching data privacy? Ethics.

That's it.

AB privacy legislation wouldn't apply.

So let's go back to the question about why this was so urgently needed to be passed by UCP in the middle of the night, and why bad actors would need health data, if the capacity already exists to ferret them out using AI analysis.

COVid has created mentally unstable individuals. Many more. Those with identified mental health issues may be receiving supports (meds, counselling), but many more remain unidentified and are struggling independent of the healthcare system.

Who's more vulnerable? Those receiving healthcare treatment and support? Or those living with mental instability & have no treatment or support?

Why would it be urgent to pass a bill in the dead of night, while COVid is raging & new mandates are being enforced?

When you answer those questions, it reveals Kenney's intent and strategy. Kenney is implementing Trump's strategy to effect a shift in power (a coup). He's already in control of Alberta. So what jurisdiction could he be hoping to impact?

In the lead up to the second COVid wave, Kenney and UCP MLAs routinely criticized everyone who advocated for a lockdown, or even a mask mandate. Opposition MLAs, physicians, Dr. Tam, community members. Kenney advocated for liberty over lives.

Several times Kenney has equated livelihoods with actual human lives. Giving priority to individual freedom over collective security. Refusing to temporarily lockdown high risk businesses and preferring to preserve their right to profit.

Still inadequate, he finally changed his tune about a mask mandate, and imposed stricter measures to aid in stemming the spread of COVid. Banning all gatherings and making masks mandatory.

His liberty loving base is apoplectic. JCCF has filed a law suit.

And now we are seeing people connected to Rebel News, Keesee Bexte, and the valuation of liberty over public safety, revolt against the public health orders. Threaten further challenges to put liberty above health safety.

You see, Q'Anon is a global death cult. Consistency in narrative is key.

They claimed it was a short-term, 'emergency' response to the COVID crisis. In March, the UK government announced a massive NHS data deal with private tech firms. Experts warned it could involve an 'unprecedented' transfer of citizens' private health information to controversial private firms like Palantir: a secretive artificial intelligence outfit founded by a Trump-backing billionaire.

During months of ensuing legal correspondence, the government assured us that this 'COVID datastore' would be unwound at the end of the pandemic and the data destroyed. They also assured us that any extension would go out to public tender, in which taxpayers could see and debate the issues at stake.

All of that has now turned out to be false. Today we can reveal that right as health secretary Matt Hancock was heralding the new vaccine and telling Britons life would be getting "back to normal" by Easter, his government was quietly sealing a lucrative deal with Palantir, worth up to £23 million, to run its massive health datastore for two years. The contract, awarded on 11 December, paves the way for Palantir to play a major, long-term role in the NHS beyond COVID – now, even by the government's own admission.

It's still not clear what precisely Palantir has been given access to: the list of NHS datasets that the firm will draw on have been redacted from the contract. What is clear, though, is that the government deliberately struck this deal on the quiet – knowing it would be controversial.

Public trust

Palantir has built software accused of fuelling racist feedback loops in the hands of the Los Angeles police, and has come under fire from its own staff over its role in the US Immigrations and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency's brutal policy of family separations.

There are no coincidences in this scenario. Like Trump, Kenney delayed public health action for as long as possible. At the same time, feeding red meat to his radicalized extremist support base made up of Dominionists and hard core libertarians who many also happen to be Q'Anon.

In the US, it's resulted in plots to kidnap and murder governors who impose public health mandates. In the UK a new health data contract with Palantir.

Kenney is following a strategic plan to permanently undermine democracy.
