To a person, we all had materials ready to support home learning over the holidays but this is now worthless. From the u turn in the summer, the SQA farce that continues, the lies about covid and schools, the lack of consideration of workload and no one standing up for us, the damage I fear is now going to be long term and potential terminal to Scottish Education under the SNP.

Pupils are exhausted, worried, acting out, and showing signs of real struggle. Closing schools is never ideal, but the thought of a longer break so people can rejuvenate and potentially see family or loved ones in a safe way was keeping many pupils and staff above water. I feel like as a teacher, if I die from covid19 complications, my job will be advertised before my funeral will be announced. Feeling unprotected, unsupported and deeply unhappy. I'm a massive Nicola Sturgeon fan and believe in Scottish independence, but I'm very concerned the governments policies and rules over the past few months have lost their impact and are causing too much confusion, will turn many teachers away from voting for the party in the next election.



In response to the latest announcement with regards to schools, I'm incredibly frustrated. My fellow colleagues are exhausted: covering classes constantly because of mass absences, working to keep pupils motivated despite worrying levels of apathy creeping into the classrooms, and stressed beyond belief because of impossible expectations and no protections.

That was the only way I and [REDACTED] would see my parents this Christmas as both are vulnerable health wise. I know it sounds dramatic but it will be the first time in my life I've not seen them on Christmas. I'm raging!!!

I have never known anger like it. It is like they are playing a game of winding teachers up to test at what point they will flip. The SNP were the ones who leaked/briefed out the idea of an early finish then THEY backtracked when dipping their toe in the water (which was the whole point) provoked the parental backlash. Timid, timid, timid.

ALSO the bigger picture is- still nothing on Highers, nothing. It is fucking December.

Hi James. This is rock bottom. I don't think I've ever been so exhausted. We are rushing kids through a higher course when we're not even sure if they'll sit the exam. Every day brings a new positive case and more kids isolating. Every day is hard work and fear. I've never seen teacher morale so low. And the pupils are exhausted too. They are scared they're going to harm their families. Schools are incredibly unhappy places just now and the mental health of pupils and teachers is declining by the day. A truly dark time.

Couldn't agree more with the thread of DMs from other teachers. I have taught my own lessons in my department today as well as covering for two other departments in the school for absent teachers. I have just returned to work following a difficult time battling covid and have recently been bereaved as a result of it. I am physically and emotionally unwell and I don't know how long I can last with things as they are. I've lost my love for this job and for the SNP. I am pro independence but will find it exceptionally difficult to ever vote SNP again after the utter contempt teachers have been shown. We are being treated like glorified babysitters and our lives are at risk because of it. I'm devastated.

As a pupil, in S5 studying my Highers, this year has been stressful, I knew it would be stressful. I had to shield, yet I can't distance at school. I'm getting tested in every subject all the time, with my prelims happening in January. It's unacceptable what the SQA and John Swinney is doing. I live in a level 1 area and my school hasn't had a case, but attendance is still low as people keep dropping out to get a test and then coming back. Teachers are off due to stress. It was 12C in my classroom yesterday, and it is going to get worse. I can't study well, when I'm sitting in my jacket freezing. My friends are bringing blankets in. We
