Andersen, a professor in the Department of Immunology and Microbiology at the Scripps Research Institute on Oct. 17 wrote on Twitter, "I'm not reluctant to investigating labs - in fact, I believe I have even suggested doing that." Eddie Holmes, an evolutionary biologist and virologist and professor at the University of Sydney then replied, "Completely agree Kristian. I'm not against it either, although I think it detracts from the key point that emergence is about the human interaction with the animal world."

On Dec. 2, Trevor Bedford, an associate professor at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center Vaccine and Infectious Disease Division, posted Relman's article on Twitter and wrote, "Short answer is that I don't (and never did) consider lab accident hypothesis a 'conspiracy theory' and believe it should be addressed scientifically."
